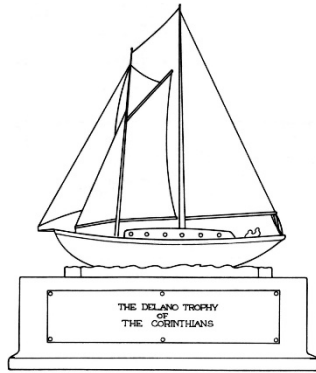

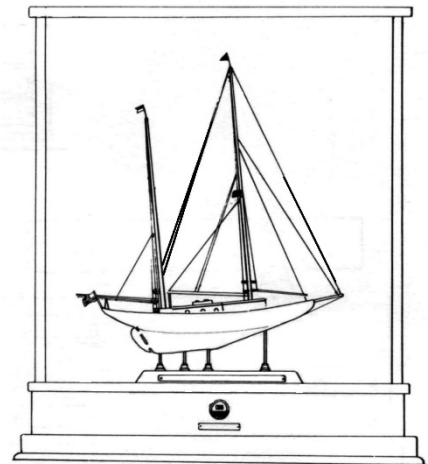


The Delano Trophy

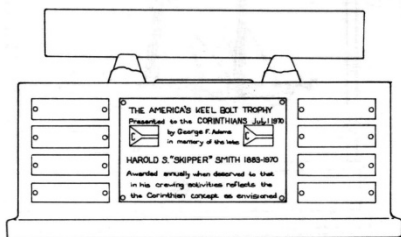
The Delano Trophy, an English pewter model of a schooner mounted on a black wooden base, is awarded annually by the Afterguard, when deserved, to that member who, in the preceding year, best typifies the spirit of the Association and that of one of its founders, Frederick M. Delano.

The Cooke Trophy

The Cooke Memorial Trophy, a glass encased model of the ketch Seven Bells, yacht of Corinthian co-founder Carleton S. Cooke, is awarded from time to time by the Afterguard to recognize distinguished and unpublicized service to the Association, thereby perpetuating the memory of Carleton S. Cooke, whose career exemplified the spirit of the award. The trophy is presently prominently on display in a place of honor at Eastport Yacht Club in Annapolis, MD.



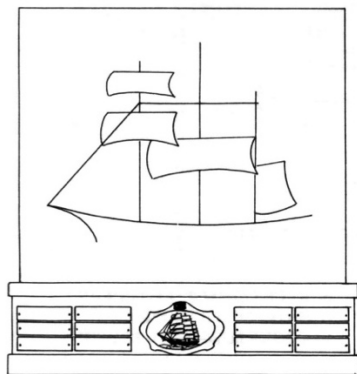
The America's Keel Bolt Trophy



This trophy is part of a keel bolt salvaged from the original schooner yacht America by Captain George F. Adams, U.S.N.R. (Ret.). It was presented to The Corinthians on July 1, 1970 in memory of the late Harold S. "Skipper" Smith, 1883-1970. It is awarded annually, when deserved, to that member who, in his crewing activities, reflects the essence of the concept of The Corinthians as envisioned by the founders. The winner, nominated by the Crewing Committee, may be skipper, crew, or yacht owner.

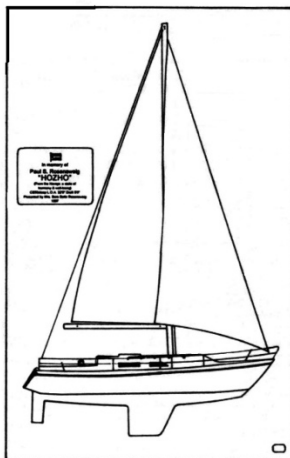
The Navigators Trophy

The Navigators Trophy is a tiffany silver bowl of unique and graceful proportions mounted on a base of African rosewood. In July 1987 it was presented to The Corinthians by Dr. Richard T. Sanborn in memory of Corinthian shipmate Dr. Allen E. Robertson (1921-1979). The Navigators Trophy is awarded annually when deserved in recognition of a noteworthy performance in navigation.



The Cutty Sark Trophy

The Cutty Sark Trophy is an impressionistic rendering of a clipper-bowed square rigger encased in a lucite block. It was presented by Robert Marsh to be awarded, when deserved, to a member who has successfully completed an outstanding voyage or who has demonstrated prowess as a seaman.

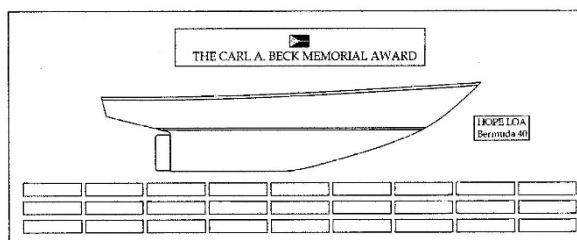


The Paul Rosensweig Memorial Trophy

A tragic accident took Paul Rosensweig's life in 1996 on his return from a volunteer Corinthian crewing assignment. Sara Belle Rosensweig offers this trophy to be awarded annually, when deserved, to that Corinthian who best exemplifies Paul's dedication to helping others and demonstrating leadership through example. The trophy is a fully rigged half-model of Paul's CS 33 sloop named HOZHO — a word and concept taken from the Navajo language implying well-being, harmony, and beauty.

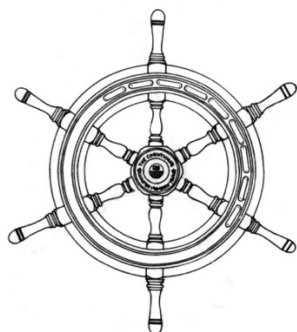
The Carl A. Beck Memorial Award

First awarded in 2006, the Carl A. Beck Memorial Trophy is a half model of Carl's Bermuda 40, HOPE LOA. Donated by his late daughter, Jan B. Wilson, it is awarded annually to a member to recognize his achievements in encouraging participation, activities, and membership growth among young people.



The Corinthians Ocean Racing Trophy

The trophy, a rendering in crystal of a sail capturing the wind, was presented to The Corinthians in December 1989 by Raymond S. Peterson. It is awarded annually, when deserved, to a Corinthian skipper who has demonstrated exceptional skills and success in ocean racing. The recipient of the trophy is selected by a committee of three Corinthian Master Mariners chosen by the current Master.

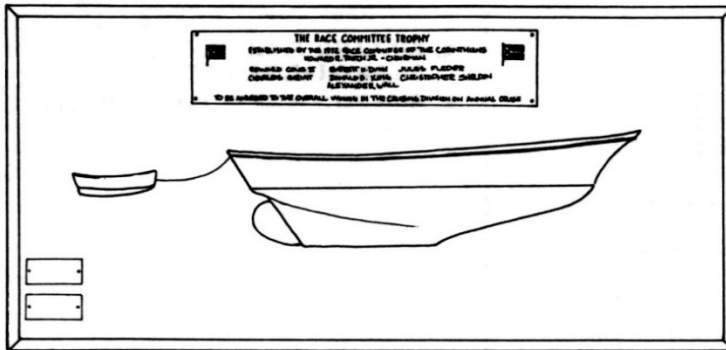


The Charter Members Trophy

The Charter Members Trophy is a handsome spoked, ship's wheel with The Corinthians' insigne on the hub. This trophy, honoring our original members, is awarded to the overall winner of the Racing Division on the Annual Race/Cruise.

The Corinthians Perpetual Trophy Annual Race/Cruise

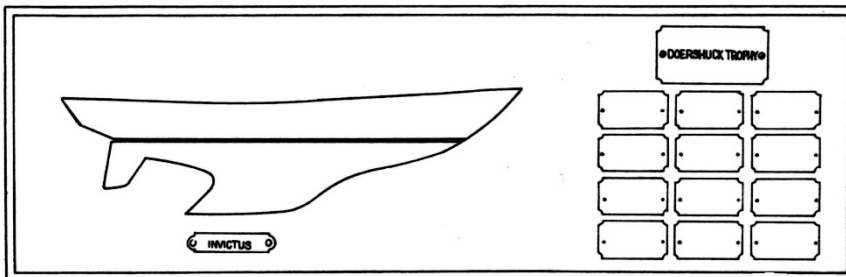
Beginning in 1987, this trophy, a Revere-style silver bowl, is awarded to the overall winner of Cruising Division I of The Corinthians' Annual Race/Cruise. Prior to 1987, this trophy was awarded as a perpetual racing trophy to the winner of the Racing Division of The Corinthians' Spring and Fall races.



The Race Committee Trophy

The Race Committee Trophy is a clipper-bowed half-model of a yacht trailing a dinghy mounted on a mahogany plaque. It is awarded to the overall winner of Cruising Division II of the Annual Race/Cruise.

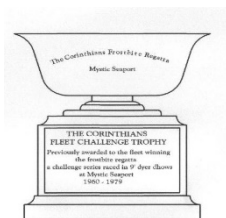
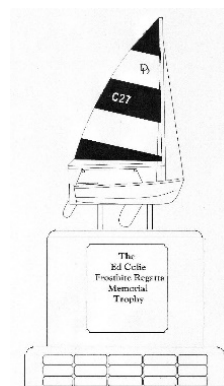
The John Doerschuck Memorial Trophy



The trophy, a half model of John Doerschuck's 42' sloop, Invictus, is mounted on a mahogany plaque and is awarded annually to the winner of the Single-Handed Race in Western Long Island Sound. The trophy was given in 1986 in memory of John Doerschuck by Master Mariner Charles H. Weiner.

The Ed Colie Frostbite Regatta Memorial Trophy

This trophy, a scale model of Ed Colie's dinghy 'Puddy' mounted on a mahogany base with curved brass plaques, is awarded annually to the winner of the Frostbite Regatta. This one-day regatta, raced in Mystic Seaport Museum Dyer Dhows, was revived in 1993. The trophy was presented to The Corinthians by Fran Colie in 1995



The Fleet Challenge Trophy

(formerly The Corinthians Frostbite Regatta Trophy)

The trophy, a sterling silver Revere bowl mounted on a mahogany base, is awarded to the winner of the Fleet Challenge Race. The trophy is held by the winning Fleet Captain. The annual listings below indicate the type of boats used and the location of the event.



Race Cruise Dinghy Race Trophy

The Race Cruise Dinghy Race Trophy is a mahogany sailboard rudder suitably finished and emblazoned with the Corinthian flag. First awarded in 1996, it is presented to the overall winner of the dinghy races held during the annual Corinthian race cruise.

The Ancient Mariner's Trophy

Both the Ancient Mariner's Race and its trophy are unique. The singular entrance requirement for the race is that the skipper be 60 years of age or older and that the crew be 50 years of age or older.

The Salty Pot Award

The Salty Pot Award is a chef's pot and is awarded for the best "offshore" recipe submitted at the Gourmet Gam. A winning offshore recipe is one which yields excellent results and is judged to be relatively easy to prepare in the galley while at sea in what could be described as adverse conditions.

The Nothing Award

At the closing dinner of The Corinthians' annual cruise, the Nothing Award is bestowed upon that skipper who has, while on the cruise, performed some observable and notable misfeasance of seamanship or navigation about which it is best to remember nothing. The award itself is a large, ungainly and heavy broken-down ship's searchlight
